- Welders, Cutters, Solderers, and Brazers increased by 151 from 2015-2020 (84.4%), outpacing the national growth rate of 1.8%. The occupation is projected to decrease by 1 from 2020-2025 (-0.3%), less than the national projected growth rate of 4.3%.
- Regional job concentration per capita for Welders, Cutters, Solderers, and Brazers is 3.30 times the national job concentration. In other words, there are 230% more Welders, Cutters, Solderers, and Brazers in this region than we would expect to find in the average region.
- Cost of labor in the region is below median. The median earnings for Welders, Cutters, Solderers, and Brazers in the region is \$17.97/hr, which is \$3.28/hr below the national median of \$21.25/hr.



Institution Data

Location Quotient

Location quotient (LQ) is a way of quantifying how concentrated a particular industry, cluster, occupation, or demographic group is in a region as compared to the nation. It can reveal what makes a particular region unique in comparison to the national average.

Occupation Data

Emsi occupation employment data are based on final Emsi industry data and final Emsi staffing patterns. Wage estimates are based on Occupational Employment Statistics (QCEW and Non-QCEW Employees classes of worker) and the American Community Survey (Self-Employed and Extended Proprietors). Occupational wage estimates are also affected by county-level Emsi earnings by industry.
